# David Nimmer

---

As revision editor of the renowned *Nimmer on Copyright* since 1985, David Nimmer has greatly influenced the field of copyright law. The treatise, first published in 1963 by his late father, Melville B. Nimmer, is recognized as the standard reference work in the field and has been widely cited by courts at all levels in both the United States and abroad.

Mr. Nimmer is of counsel at Irell & Manella LLP in Los Angeles, where he represents clients in the entertainment, publishing, and high-technology fields. He has testified before Congress and Parliament, served as chairman of the ABA's Committee on Intellectual Properties Litigation, and published a number of influential articles on U.S. and international copyright law.
