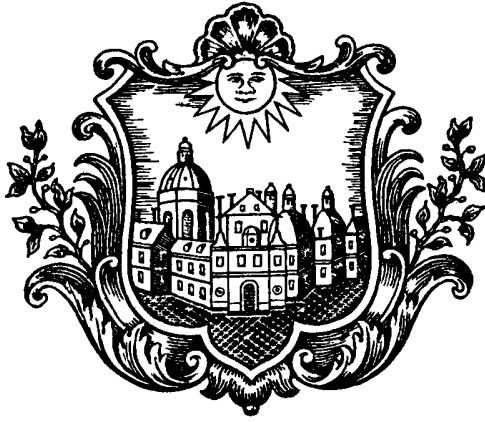

Rollins Professor Peter A. Alces received his A.B. from Lafayette College (*summa cum laude*), and his J.D. from the University of Illinois (*magna cum laude*). Prior to joining the William & Mary faculty in 1991, he was the John S. Stone Faculty Fellow, University of Alabama School of Law. He also has been a visiting professor at Washington & Lee, Washington University, and Texas law schools.

He is the author of numerous books, including: *The Law of Suretyship and Guaranty; Bankruptcy: Cases and Materials; Cases, Problems and Materials on Payment Systems; The Commercial Law of Intellectual Property; Sales, Leases and Bulk Transfers; The Law of Fraudulent Transactions; and Uniform Commercial Code Transactions Guide*. He has also published articles in the *Northwestern, Michigan, Minnesota, Illinois, North Carolina, Fordham, California, Texas, William and Mary Law, Ohio State and Georgetown* law journals.

Professor Alces's most recent publication, "Contract Reconceived," will be published in a 2001 issue of the **Northwestern University Law Review**.
