Professor Dwyer is the author of numerous scholarly articles in William & Mary Bill of rights Journal, Government, Law and Policy Journal, William and Mary Law Review, Notre Dame Law Review, Journal of Contemporary Health Law and Policy, Santa Clara Law Review, North Carolina Law Review and California Law Review. His books include Vouchers Within Reason: A Child-Centered Approach to Education Reform and Religious Schools v. Children's Rights, both published by Cornell University Press.
