# ERIC A. KADES

Professor Eric A. Kades is a nationally known scholar in the fields of property rights and economic development.

His articles have appeared in *Law & History Review*, *Northwestern University Law Review*, the *Yale Law Journal*, and the *University of Pennsylvania Law Review*.

Professor Kades received his B.A. and J.D. from Yale University, where he was an Articles Editor of the *Yale Law Journal*, and clerked for Judge Morton I. Greenberg on the Third Circuit.

He began his academic career at Wayne State University in Detroit, where he received three teaching awards.

Since joining the William & Mary law faculty in 2002, Professor Kades has been honored with the 2004 Walter L. Williams, Jr., Teaching Award, a 2004 Alumni Fellowship Award, and the 2011 John Marshall Award.

He served as the Law School's Vice Dean from 2008-11 and is past director of the William & Mary Property Rights Project.
