Professor James G. Dwyer joined the William & Mary Law faculty in 2000 after teaching law at the Chicago-Kent College of Law and the University of Wyoming College of Law.

Prior to teaching, he practiced law with Sutherland, Asbill, and Brennan; and Coudert Brothers; both in Washington, D.C., and worked in New York State Family Court as a Law Guardian and Assigned Counsel.

Professor Dwyer teaches family law, youth law, and law and social justice. He was selected for the Class of 2010 Professorship, and he has twice been the recipient of the Plumeri Award.

He is the author of *History and Philosophy of Homeschooling* (University of Chicago Press, forthcoming 2015), *Moral Status and Human Life: The Case for Children's Superiority* (Cambridge University Press 2011), *The Relationship Rights of Children* (Cambridge University Press 2006), and numerous other books and articles.
