FORMER SPECIAL ENVOY TO IRELAND WILL DISCUSS IMPLICATIONS OF THE NORTHERN IRELAND PEACE PROCESS, MITCHELL REISS, who served until February 2007 as the President's Special Envoy for the Northern Ireland Peace Process with the rank of Ambassador, will deliver a lecture at William & Mary Law School co-sponsored by the HUMAN RIGHTS AND NATIONAL SECURITY LAW PROGRAM AND STUDENTS DEFENDING DEMOCRACY. Entitled "The Northern Ireland Peace Process: How Pertinent a Model for Other Conflicts?" the talk will be presented on January 31 at 5:00 p.m. in Room 127 of the Law School, and is free and open to the public.

Drawing on his expertise as Special Envoy, Reiss will explore the lessons that can be derived from the resolution of the Troubles. In particular, Reiss will consider the implications of these lessons for other civil conflicts around the world, asking, "What do these tragic events have to say about fighting terrorism? About developing a political path away from terror? About the role of outside parties to the conflict? In short, can Northern Ireland serve as a model for the peaceful resolution of other disputes?"

Please feel free to include this flier with your resumes and cover letters to government and public service employers. In your cover letter, you may want to indicate that "William & Mary has several public interest [or government] summer funding sources, as detailed on the enclosed sheet." The application process for these fellowships is very competitive, and you must have a written offer of employment in order to apply for funding. The application deadline is Friday, March 21 at 5:00 p.m.

#### Summer employment as a Research Assistant offers a number of attractive benefits:

• Flexibility of when and where the hours are worked. A student may be able to split the summer with another employer and/or do the RA work from a location other than

Williamsburg. The work need not necessarily be done during "normal business hours" as long as it's completed thoroughly and in a timely manner.

- Interesting, challenging work, often dealing with emerging legal issues.
- Opportunity to produce one or more writing samples.
- Chance to build a relationship with a faculty member who can serve as a reference for a future job search.
- Opportunity to develop a working knowledge of one or more areas of law.
- Prospect of developing additional professional contacts with and referrals to lawyers whom the professor knows.
- Potential for work being acknowledged in the professor's articles or treatises.
- It's paid work!

Some of the application deadlines are soon; others are later in the semester. **However, we advise interested students not to wait**. Faculty members frequently conclude the process as soon as the right student comes along. The table in Blackboard explains the application procedure and requirements.
