

### **NEW FACULTY**

We have one new faculty member joining us this fall. **Associate Professor Vivian Hamilton** received her law degree from Harvard and her B.A. from Yale. While at Harvard she served as an Articles Editor for the *Civil Rights-Civil Liberties Law Review*. After graduating from law school, Professor Hamilton clerked for the Honorable Gladys Kessler of the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia, then joined the D.C. firm of Steptoe & Johnson for a year before working for the Legal Aid Society, then directing a clinic at American University, and finally teaching at West Virginia University College of Law. An expert in family law, Professor Hamilton will be teaching the basic Family Law course as well as an advanced family law advocacy seminar.

### **VISITING FACULTY**

Finally, **Maria López-Contreras González**, a lawyer and professor of European Law at the Universidad de León (Spain) who teaches in our Madrid program, will be at the Law School in spring 2008 teaching The Practical Application of Basic Principles of EU Law.

The Bar Application, itself, cannot be filed more than three months prior to sitting for the exam.

Those planning to sit for the Virginia Bar are forewarned that the Virginia Board of Bar Examiners requires applicants to take the Multi-state Professional Responsibility Examination (MPRE).
