NEW LIBRARY SECURITY SYSTEM UPDATE

Following a meeting with security installation representatives, we have decided to make several small changes to the security system. Therefore, the system will not be operational until Monday, September 16. At noon on that date the system will be "turned on" and alarms will ring.

Faculty and students are advised to scan their ID cards through the reader on the library front door to ensure the card is properly programmed to the law school system. The yellow light should turn green if your card "works". If not, you need to contact campus police to correct programming errors, or the ID office to correct a card malfunction. We understand some inconveniences will initially result, but feel once fully operational the new security system will provide better and safer access to the law school community and building contents.
