- I. Discuss the questions in pgh. b, p. 303 (beginning, "Note that the Darby opinion...") by drawing specific examples from the cases and other materials in Section 5 of this chapter. Note that there are five separate questions in this paragraph.
- II. There are twelve questions in pgh. 1a on p. 641. One-sentence answers are possible for most of these, provided the sentence is explicit.
- III. On p. 685 there are six questions in the second pgh. (beginning, "In examining these materials..."). Follow procedure in Ques. II.
- IV. Discuss in detail the questions in the opening pgh. on p. 983; as in Ques. I, this will require drawing specific examples from the material in the chapter generally. Note that there are four questions involved.
- V. On p. 1227 the second pgh. (beginning, "Part A of this section...") Discuss in detail the two questions raised therein, with a careful analysis of the cases in Part A.

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
