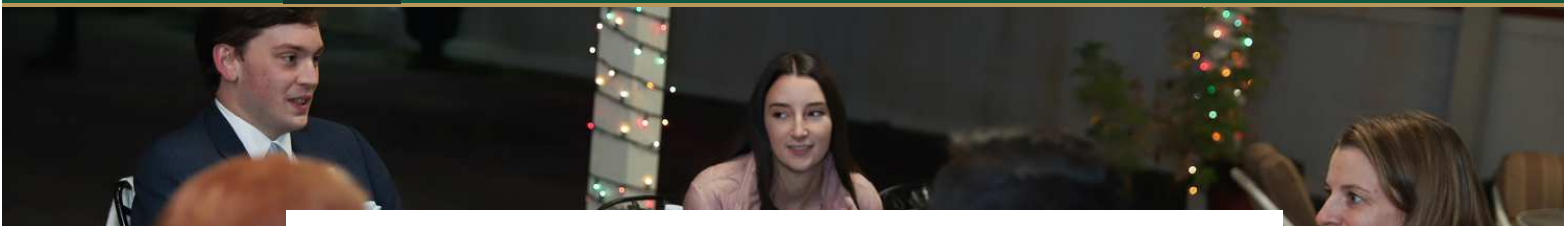

The Roberts Court and Race
