THE ANTITRUST LAWS OF THE U.S.A.

By A. D. NEALE. New York: Cambridge University Press, 1960. XVI, 516 pp. \$7.50

A. D. Neale, a British civil servant, has prepared this thorough study of the peculiarly American institution of anti-trust law for the purpose of informing British businessmen and lawyers. His result is believed to be useful as well to American lawyers and businessmen concerned with antitrust law. The book is amazingly clear and concise; the pertinent statutes are examined, the principally influential case precedents are analyzed and the underlying philosophy is well illumined.

The author prepared the book in the United States under the auspices of a Fellowship Fund; this resulted in an accurate and refreshingly objective examination and appraisal of our anti-trust laws. Mr. Neale has no axe to grind and his detachment from American influence is evident. This study is heartily recommended to anyone interested in the subject of antitrust law.
