

# 2012-2013 Intellectual Property Student Writing Competition

Georgia State Intellectual Property invites students to participate in the second annual Intellectual Property Writing Competition. We seek student submissions on intellectual property topics. Papers must represent original works not previously published or targeted for submission to another journal until the winning papers are announced.

Winners will be determined by the sole discretion of Georgia State University College of Law. Criteria for judging include: originality of thought, contributions to law and practice, completeness of scholarly research, and overall style and content of work.

## Prizes include:

First place: \$3,000

Second place: \$2,000

Third place: \$1,000

The winning paper will be published in the conference materials for the 2013 Corporate IP Institute meeting, an annual two-day event where approximately 200 IP professionals gather to discuss current intellectual property issues, stories and strategies of corporations.
